### *Diego G. Quejada*

*Reynaldo D. Raluto* is a Roman Catholic priest of the Diocese of Malaybalay. His research interest lies on narrative ethics, liberation ethics, Catholic Social Tradition, and virtue ethics. He is a member of DAKATEO, an Association of Filipino Theologians in the Philippines. He has been very involved in ecumenical movement and one of the founding members of the Quezon City Ecumenical Fellowship in 2012. Presently, he also serves as Executive Director of the Philippine Action for Community-led Shelter Initiatives, Inc. (PACSII), an NGO serving the Homeless Peoples Federation Philippines, Inc. (HPFPI).
